In closing here is a brief summary of other projects the city is monitoring or participating in at this time:

- * <u>HERR LANE STUDY</u>: Input has been received from local residents for the design team to evaluate and develop potential improvements. This project is funded by Metro Louisville and is coordinated through Metro Council member Angela Leet's office.
- WESTPORT ROAD CORRIDOR STUDY: This is another Metro Louisville sponsored project funded through Council members Angela Leet and Glen Stuckel. This project is studying Westport Road from Snyder Freeway to Hubbard's Lane to determine ways to ease congestion and improve traffic flow.
- * <u>ORMSBY LANE SIDEWALK</u>: Another ongoing project from Council member Leet is the planning and funding of a sidewalk on Ormsby Lane from Old Lagrange Road to Westport Road. A public meeting was held for comments on April 18th and final design plans will be prepared within the next few months. This project has been partially funded through Metro Louisville.
- * VA HOSPITAL: The Environmental Impact Statement was just released and is under review.

Speeders Beware - Chief Grady Thornberry

Since traffic on the side streets of Graymoor-Devondale and our contract cities is always a concern for residents, we've added a tool to increase driver awareness and reduce speeding. Recently your police department purchased an automated electronic speed sign that we can move to different locations within Graymoor-Devondale and our partner cities. The sign alerts drivers to their actual speed, intensifies the alert with flashing numbers when the speed exceeds the posted limit, and flashes red and blue lights if the speed reaches a dangerous level. The device also captures photos of speeding vehicles and drivers.

Numerous reports are available from the data collected. During a recent test of the device on Applewood we were able to determine average speeds, the number of vehicles exceeding the posted limit, and the number of vehicles that slowed down as they approached the sign regardless of their beginning speed. The results were impressive in terms of making drivers aware and encouraging them to reduce speeds. Also of note is that the device records traffic counts. During this test on Applewood we learned that the average daily (24 hour) one-way traffic count on Applewood was just over 400 cars.

We want to thank Louisville Metro Councilwoman Angela Leet for helping underwrite the purchase of this device with Neighborhood Development Funds. We appreciate her commitment to the safety of our residents.

- Entrance—Exit: Residents dropping off items at this event will use the St. Albert's entrance on Girard behind the church. There will be signs that direct drivers to the entrance of the drop off areas and then to the exit by the gym parking lot. For safety reasons, drives must use the designated entrance on Girard.
- Document Shredding: Limit of four (4) boxes/bags of paper and cds per vehicle.
- Electronics: Batteries, Cable, CDs, Cell Phones, Circuit Boards, Computers, Consumer Electronics, Game Consoles, Ink and Toner Cartridges, IT Equipment, Keyboards, Laptops, Mice, Modems, Monitors, MP3 Players, Network Equipment, Phone Systems, Printers, Routers, Satellite Boxes, Servers, Speakers, Switches, Telecom Equipment, UBS Units, Video Games and Wire. TV's will not be accepted.
- Old Shoes Donations: Residents are encouraged to bring shoes that can be donated and re-purposed by WaterStep. By donating your gently used shoes to WaterStep you help fund safe drinking water projects all over the world.
- REACH Alert System Registration for Graymoor-Devondale Residents: Residents that register their email address or phone number(s) will receive important and timely messages from the Graymoor-Devondale Police Department or city officials using the REACH Alert System. City officials and police officers will be available to assist residents with registration.



The Graymoor-Devondale Police Department has a new and effective tool to track speeders.

While it's purpose is to alert and slow drivers down to the speed limit, it has a feature that takes photos of the speeding car and driver!
